

## Course outline

We offer a **7 week automotive training program** - 3 days per week  
(Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday - 20 hours) for young people 15 and 21 years old.

For nearly 25 years, we have been successfully delivering the Hand Brake Turn program. With over 9,000 students already trained and a 90% completion rate, our program works!

Our next program starts in **Dandenong** from **20<sup>th</sup> March – 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2018**.

### Course fees below:

Learner	Cost
Concession, eligible for Learn Local Funding	\$100
Non-Concession, eligible for Learn Local Funding	\$800 (inc. non refundable \$150 fee)
Concession, not eligible for Learn Local Funding	\$1,000
Non-Concession, not eligible for Learn Local Funding	\$1,785 (inc. non refundable \$150 fee)

**Note:** Where possible, we will access available funding to subsidise the cost of training.

Concession eligibility requires evidence of Health Care Card or Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin.

- Practical **hands on learning experience** within a fully equipped automotive workshop
- Technical skills including **automotive care skills**, OH&S, industry knowledge, computer skills, finance, language, numeracy and literacy skills
- **Life skills** including self reflection, goal setting, managing expectations, creative expression, self confidence, social and communication skills
- Improved well being for participants and **increased engagement** with families and community
- Strong foundation and knowledge for various job roles particularly in the automotive industry
- Opportunity to explore **alternative training** and further **education pathways**
- Successful transition into the labour market
